

HISTORY

The Central Lenoir and Sewer District (WSD) was formed in April, 2003. It is the first of five (5) WSD's created by the Lenoir County Board of Commissioners and it is the southernmost in Lenoir County.

The Central Lenoir WSD generally borders Falling Creek and Trent Townships and Falling Creek, and West Lenoir Water and Sewer Districts to the West, Woodington Township to the East, Falling Creek Township, City of Kinston Corporate Limits, Falling Creek and West Lenoir Water and Sewer Districts to the North, and the Woodington and Trent Townships and Deep Run Water and Sewer Districts to the South.

INITIAL PROJECT

The Central Lenoir WSD will have a Waste Water Treatment Plant purchased. It will have 15.63 miles of gravity sewer lines installed, one (1) Pump Station, and 1.8 miles of Force Main. The immediate service area will be Jackson Heights with 742 residence and 17 commercial businesses at an estimated total of \$7,457,000.

BENEFITS
