

HISTORY

The East Lenoir and Sewer District (WSD) was formed in April, 2003. It is the first of five (5) WSD's created by the Lenoir County Board of Commissioners and it is the southernmost in Lenoir County.

The East Lenoir WSD generally borders Vance Township, City of Kinston Corporate Limits to the West, Sand Hill Township and Craven County to the East, Greene County, Pitt County, Town of Grifton Corporate Limits to the North, and the Southwest Township and City of Kinston Corporate Limits to the South.

INITIAL PROJECT

The East Lenoir WSD will have Kinston Waste Water Treatment Plant Capacity charges. It will have 6.75 miles of gravity sewer lines installed, two (2) pump stations, and 3.2 miles of Force Main. The immediate service area will consist of Savannah and Contentnea Schools with the possibility of Dupont connecting to the system. There will be 177 customers initially at a cost of \$3,399,000.
